ANC Supports Call for Improvements in Horizontal Management

The recently released report of the Auditor General included a review of federal government efforts in the area of horizontal management. It concluded that the government, especially central agencies such as Treasury Board, needed to step up their efforts to guide and support such initiatives.

While Action for Neighbourhood Change (ANC) was not discussed in the report, it offers a positive example of how multiple federal government departments and non-government partners can work together to tackle complex issues – albeit often swimming against the stream.

In a commentary on the Auditor General's findings, "There's Madness to this Method," the Caledon Institute's Sherri Torjman points to ANC as an indication of horizontal collaboration in action. Sherri reiterates the Auditor General's call for improvements to horizontal management within the federal government that will enable these initiatives to more easily achieve their full potential.

ANC Updates – What’s New

Policy Dialogue Strikes Two Working Groups

During the ANC Policy Forum held in October, participants identified a number of key issues to help advance government/community collaboration for neighbourhood renewal.

As a follow-up to the discussions at the ANC Policy Forum, working groups have been established to address two priority issues. One group will prepare a neighbourhood revitalization logic model to help guide the work of all partners in these initiatives. A second group will prepare a discussion paper on the role of community capacity building in neighbourhood revitalization and prepare recommendations on necessary investments in this area. The working groups will present the results of their work to the full Policy Dialogue group in February and finalize their reports in March.
